OWL values self-worth, sexual health, responsibility, justice and inclusivity. In eight one-hour workshops that will take place during the Celebration of Life services this fall, OWL will model and teach caring, compassion, respect and justice. It helps children in grades 4-6 understand the physical and emotional changes of puberty. Participants explore values, communication, and decision-making as well as physical health and development.














#### KRCRC AT THE FAIR
